Turnip - 2 Harvest Basket: 1

display of Agricultural Products,  
minimum 10 varieties.

The Harvest Basket must contain a minimum of 10 different agricultural products. One basket per family may be entered in this class. All products shall conform to the rules for that item. Greens and lettuce, suggest submitting as a whole plant in water to avoid wilting. The outer skin of onions should be removed.

Avoid over-mature products.

Products will be judged on size, shape, cleanliness, uniformity and freedom from disease and insect damage.

Maple syrup must be graded, and may be entered in each of the four grades.

Maple entries will be displayed at the Maple Sugarhouse.

One entry per family per class will be allowed, however, for vegetables, a maximum of 10 entries are allowed.

Only one premium will be paid on the same variety to an exhibitor.

Products will be awarded Blue

Ribbons for Excellent entries, plus

cash awards. A “Best of the Show”

ribbon will recognize the outstanding entry in each class.

The Lamoille County Maple Sugar Makers’ Association will pay a \$50 premium for the best syrup.

Judging will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Thursday by representatives from the Vermont Agency of Agriculture. The

building will be closed to the public during judging.
