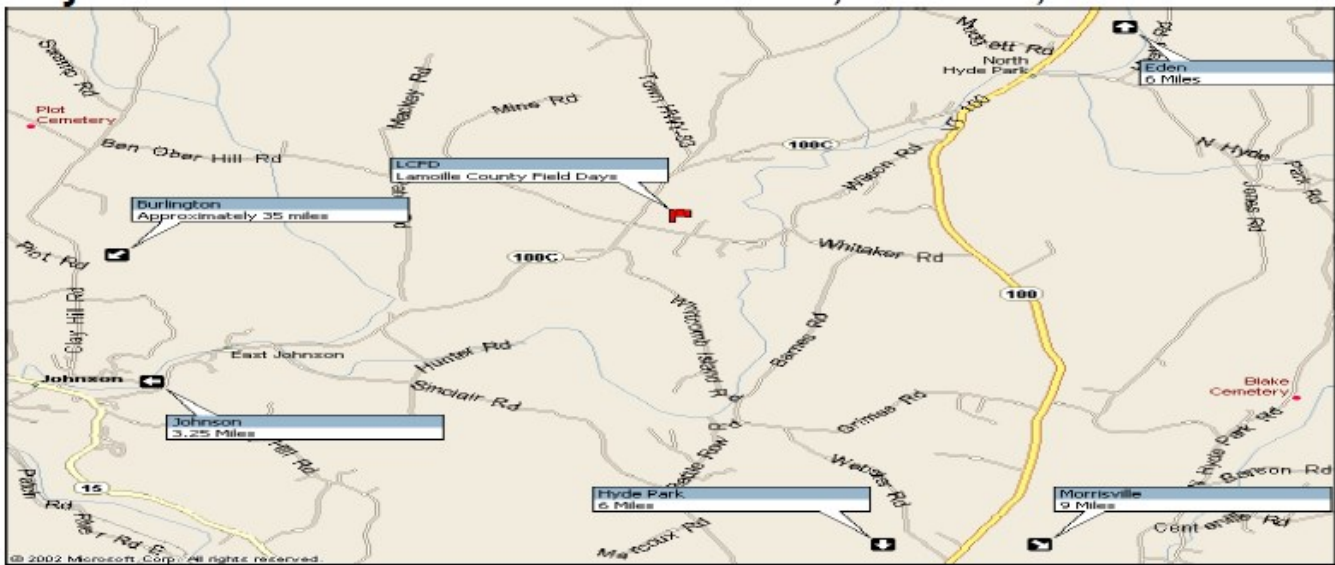

## Lamoille County Field Days Youth Horse Show

### SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

#### GROUND & ARENA

1. Lamoille County Field Days (LCFD) prohibits the use of alcohol on the fairgrounds and dogs on the grounds with the exception of Service Dogs.
2. By entering in a Lamoille County Field Days Open Horse Show every participant agrees to abide by Lamoille County Field Days rules.
3. No Stabling is available on the grounds. Exhibitors may arrive on the fairgrounds starting at 7:00 a.m. and all horses must be removed within 2 hours of the conclusion of the show. Please pickup after yourself and your horse(s) before leaving.
4. Riders must be in control of their horse at all times when on the fairgrounds. No cantering outside of the Main arena, or Warm-up arena. Warm-up arena is located to the left of the gate to the main arena and will be marked as such. No horses are allowed around the snack food area.
5. **Approved ASTM helmets are required for all riders.**
6. Horses that kick should have a RED ribbon tied in their tails. All stallions should have a YELLOW ribbon tied in their tail.

#### REGISTRATION & CLASSES

1. Registration opens at 8:30 a.m. and closes 15 minutes prior to the posted start time.

2. All entries must be signed by participant and participant's birth date must be given. Proof of age must be given, if requested by an official committee member. In case of a minor (under 18 years of age), the entry form must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
3. All fees must be paid by the participant before the participant will be allowed to compete. No entry will be permitted in the ring unless they have paid or a signed open check is left with the Secretary.
4. There will be a returned check fee of \$50.00. The participant will not be allowed to compete again until the total amount due including the returned check fee is paid in cash. Lamoille County Field Days reserves the right to demand cash payment from individuals who have issued a check returned for insufficient funds.
5. NO REFUNDS will be given, UNLESS ILLNESS OR INJURY WITH NOTE FROM DOCTOR/VET SUBMITTED TO MANAGEMENT BY NOON Friday. Refunds may be given, at the discretion of the Show Manager.
6. REQUIRED EQUINE PAPERWORK: A negative coggins and rabies certificate within the past 12 months is required to enter the premises for all horses whether participating in the day's classes or not, and must be presented when entering classes. Breed Registration forms must be presented to enter any breed specific classes.
7. OUT OF STATE HORSES must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection dated within 30 days available OR an Extended Exhibition Permit.
8. Due to recent outbreaks of EHV, we strongly recommend all horses receive the Rhino vaccination at least 3 weeks prior to show season and not more than 6 months prior to. It is also recommended that while at our event you check your horse's temperature at least twice to help ensure the safety of all horses.
9. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the requirements and specifications of the classes they enter. LCFD is not responsible if exhibitors are disqualified or penalized by the judge or steward for using unconventional/incorrect tack or attire for the class.
10. DELAY OF CLASSES/HOLDS: Every effort has been made to avoid class conflicts and tack changes. If either should occur, a hold of four (4) minutes, will be allowed if the show steward is notified at least three (3) classes beforehand. The exhibitor with the tack hold may be excused from the ring when judge's cards are handed into the Secretary's booth. The Steward is to time tack holds starting when the last exhibitor leaves the ring. The InGate will be closed two (2) minutes after the first animal enters the ring unless there is a hold or tack change noted by the steward. Exhibitors must be on time for their classes to keep the show moving along. In the event that the PA system fails, exhibitors will still be expected to appear on time. No refunds for failing to enter the ring on time.
11. MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO: add to or change the name of invited official(s); decline or refuse any entry at this show without being held liable; eliminate from further competition any exhibitor or equine should the best interest of the show be served; not delay classes due to conflicts, and not to allow substitutions of animals or classes; change the order of classes before or during the show and combine or cancel classes. Should questions or disputes arise not provided for in the foregoing rules, the same shall be referred to the show steward/secretary whose decision shall be final.

## **Class Descriptions**

**Leadline Division** To be led by someone, 14 years old or older. Open to exhibitors 10yrs and under. All lead line participants MUST wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet while showing their equine. Show management has the option to place the class 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup>. Riders over 10 years with special needs may participate with additional helpers if needed. Exhibitors may not cross enter into any other division.

**New Beginner-** Ages 12 and under, or any age rider with disabilities, all seats. Riders may be accompanied by an assistant who is at least 12 years old into the ring. Walk, limited trot. Will be judged on ability to complete the class with as little verbal assistance as needed. Will be penalized for needing hands on help.

- Showmanship is with equine shown in-hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line, and also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship.
- Equitation is based on rider's seat, hands, legs and ability to control the horse.
- Pleasure is based on the horse's ability to give a pleasurable ride

**Beginner Division** Open to horses and ponies ridden by exhibitors 18 years old and under. Open to all seats. To be shown at a walk and trot/jog ONLY. Exhibitors not to be eligible for any class that requires a canter/lope. Exhibitors in this division may not canter/lope on show grounds at any time. Exhibitors may not cross enter in Lead Line classes. Ages will be divided for riding classes in two categories 5 to 12yrs and 13 to 18yrs.

1. **BEGINNER SHOWMANSHIP** To be judged on showmanship with equine shown in-hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line, and also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship. Conformation not to count.

2. **BEGINNER EQUITATION** To be shown at a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on hands, seat and ability to handle mount.

3. **BEGINNER HORSEMANSHIP** To be shown at a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. To be judged 50% on general knowledge as determined by two questions from the judge and 50% on manners, performance and quality.

4. **BEGINNER PLEASURE** To be shown at a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Exhibitors to be judged on manners, suitability of the mount for the rider, performance and quality in that order

**Advanced Beginner Division** Open to horses and ponies ridden by exhibitors 18 years and under. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Canter/loping may be done briefly, individually or in small groups at the discretion of the judge; a small group is no more than six (6) entrants at a time. Exhibitors not eligible for any open classes requiring a canter/lope but are eligible for open walk trot classes. Open to all seats.

1. **ADVANCED BEGINNER SHOWMANSHIP** To be judged on showmanship with equine shown in-hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line, and also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship. Conformation not to count.

2. **ADVANCED BEGINNER EQUITATION** To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Canter/loping may be done briefly, individually or in small groups of no more than 6 at a time at the discretion of the judge. Rider to be judged on hands, seat and ability to handle mount.

3. **ADVANCED BEGINNER HORSEMANSHIP** To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Canter/loping may be done briefly, individually or in small groups of no more than 6 at a time at the discretion of the judge. To be judged 50% on general knowledge as determined by 2 questions from the judge, 50% on manners, performance and quality.

4. **ADVANCED BEGINNER PLEASURE** To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Canter/loping may be done briefly, individually or in small groups of no more than 6 at a time at the discretion of the judge. Mount to be judged on manners, performance and quality

**JUNIOR & SENIOR EXHIBITOR DIVISION** The Junior Exhibitor Division is open to all exhibitors ages 13 and under. The Senior Exhibitor Division is open to all exhibitors ages 14-18.

1. **JUNIOR/SENIOR EXHIBITOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES** To be judged on showmanship with equine shown in-hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line, and also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship. Conformation not to count.

A. **JUNIOR EXHIBITOR SHOWMANSHIP, 13 & UNDER**

B. **SENIOR EXHIBITOR SHOWMANSHIP, 14-18**

2. **JUNIOR/SENIOR EQUITATION CLASSES** To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring. Riders will be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, appointments, and suitability of horse to rider.

A. **JUNIOR EXHIBITOR EQUITATION 13 & UNDER**

B. **SENIOR EXHIBITOR EQUITATION 14-18**

3. **JUNIOR/SENIOR PLEASURE CLASSES** Open to English or Western. To be shown at the walk, trot/jog or alternate gate, and canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance and suitability of mount to rider. Martingales and dropped nosebands not permitted. Points count for horse/pony. Chaps are not required.

A. **JUNIOR EXHIBITOR PLEASURE 13 & UNDER**

B. **SENIOR EXHIBITOR PLEASURE 14-18**

**OPEN IN-HAND** To be judged, horse/pony will walk to the judge one at a time. As the horse/pony approaches, the judge will step to his/her right (left of the horse/pony) to enable the entry to trot straight to a cone placed 50 feet away. At the cone the entry will continue trotting, turn to the left and trot towards the wall or fence of the arena. After trotting the entries will be lined up head to tail for individual inspection by the judge. The judge shall inspect each entry from both sides, front and rear. To be judged on conformation, quality, substance, soundness and manners. Rating conformation depends upon objective valuation of balance, structural correctness, breed and sex characteristics. Only one handler allowed.

**HUNTER MODEL** Open to horses and ponies of any age. To be shown in-hand, standing only, and judged for type, quality, conformation, finish, and suitability as hunter mount. Ring procedure: entries to be brought into the ring at a walk, lined up head to tail, before being judged. No Miniature Horses.

**WESTERN MODEL** Open to horses and ponies of any age. To be shown in-hand, standing only, and judged for type, quality, conformation, finish, and suitability as western mount. Ring procedure: entries to be brought into the ring at a walk, lined up head to tail, before being judged. No Miniature Horses.

**COLOR BREED IN-HAND** To wear suitable halter or bridle. To be judged, horse/pony will walk to the judge one at a time. As the horse/pony approaches, the judge will step to his/her right (left of the horse/pony) to enable the entry to trot straight to a cone placed 50 feet away. At the cone the entry will continue trotting, turn to the left and trot towards the wall or fence of the arena. After trotting the entries will be lined up head to tail for individual inspection by the judge. The judge shall inspect each entry from both sides, front and rear. To be judged on conformation, characteristics of its color breed, quality, substance, soundness and manners. Only one handler allowed.

**PLEASURE PONY WALK/TROT** Open to any equine under 14'2 hands. To be shown at a walk and trot/jog only both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of pony for rider, performance, and quality in

that order. Rider may not cross enter into Pleasure Pony or any other class requiring a canter/lope. Advanced Beginners are allowed to show in this class.

**4H BENEFIT PLEASURE WALK/TROT** To be shown at a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Exhibitors to be judged on manners, suitability of the mount for the rider, performance and quality in that order. 50% of entries go to the Lamoille 4H Foundation.

**4H BENEFIT PLEASURE** Open to English or Western. To be shown at the walk, trot/jog or alternate gate, and canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance and suitability of mount to rider. 50% of entries go to the Lamoille 4H Foundation.

**HUNTER HACK HORSE/PONY** The Hunter Hack horse or pony should move in the same style as a working hunter. To be shown at a walk, trot, or alternate gait and canter both ways of the ring. Entrants are required to jump two (2) fences of standard white rails or rustic (natural) rails, 2' to 2'6" in height with ground lines. To be scored as in working hunter as follows: fences 60%, performance 40%. No martingales permitted.

**HUNTER HACK CROSSRAILS HORSE/PONY** The Hunter Hack horse or pony should move in the same style as a working hunter. To be shown at a walk and trot ONLY both ways of the ring on the rail. At the judge's discretion, an extension of the trot and/or halt and/or back up are optional. To jump two cross rails not to exceed 18". To be judged 60% on jumping ability and 40% on rail performance. No martingales are permitted. May not cross enter in Hunter Hack at the same show. Riders showing in classes which require a canter will be allowed to show in this class. Jumps should be ridden at a trot, however riders will not be penalized for cantering in-between fences.
